Hunan is a province located in the south central part of the People's Republic of China. It is surrounded by majestic mountains on the east, west, and south, and overlooking the Yangtze River on the north. The provincial capital city of Hunan is Changsha. There are numerous sightseeing spots in Hunan. The most popular ones include Dongting Lake and the Yueyang Pavilion, which is a famous tower built in the Tang Dynasty (618 – 907). The Zhangjaijie National

Forest Park in northwest Hunan is China's first national forest park.

Guests at the Hunan Chinese New Year party not only enjoyed delicious food and drinks, they were also entertained with numerous performances of songs, dances, and magic show. These performances showcased the various talents of the members of the Hunan Association - Dallas. The raffle drawings brought many cheers to the audience.
